In addition it is becoming increasingly difficult to cover the whole area of The Woottons because of the diminishing number of collectors. We are most grateful to everyone who has worked with us over the past few years and with John and Elisabeth Smallwood before that. It has been a remarkable achievement for The Woottons to have contributed in excess of £70,000 at more than £3,500 per year to Christian Aid. There are areas to donate in Tesco or Sainsburys at Hardwick or at Tesco Gaywood. At the moment there are shortages of tinned fruit (400g), tinned peas and carrots, biscuits, UHT milk (1 litre), breakfast cereals.
