WOOTTONS COMMUNITY CHOIR - After the summer break, the Woottons Community Choir will start again on Tuesday 11th September 7pm at South Wootton Junior School. £2 per session – no experience needed simply come along and sing.

WEDNESDAY CHURCH – From Wednesday September 19th Wednesday Church will return to the Rectory. We begin at 7pm with tea and coffee and the service begins at 7.30pm with an emphasis on sung worship and extended teaching.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY AT ALL SAINTS CHURCH – From September we will be offering teaching for children during the 10am services on the 2nd and 4th Sundays at All Saints Church. The children will be part of the congregation at the beginning and end of each service but will go with their adult leaders for their sessions for about 30 minutes each time. The children's ministry will take place in the upper room which can be reached via the balcony and is just behind the organ.

CHILDREN AND COMMUNION – the issue of whether children should receive bread and wine in church was discussed at a recent PCC meeting. James expressed his view that adult and child believers alike are part of God's story of salvation and taking part in Holy Communion is an important part of the story. James also expressed his view that to have invited children to our shared lunch at the Rectory and to allow them to see the food but not to eat it would have been absurd, so why should we exclude them from the holy meal? We agreed at the meeting that as long as their parents were in support, children attended church and were accompanied by adults at the altar they should be able to receive communion. From now on grape juice and grapes will be offered as an alternative to wine.

A DOG FOR BEN – Family Fun day we raised £1145 and the total raised has already reached £3200 – so we are nearly half way to reaching our target of £7000 already. There is recipe book available for a donation of £5 and all money is going towards A Dog for Ben. It contains lots of recipes from Rainbows, Brownies, children from Breakfast at 10 and local friends in the community. The recipe books are available to buy at Breakfast at 10 or you can order through Janet Kier in church. If you wish to make a donation to “A Dog for Ben” please make your cheque payable to “The Church in the Woottons PCC” and make it clear that the money is for this project.

NAKWERO SUPPER PARTY RESULT - The proceeds from the party held on 20 July totaled £590.00. This excellent sum is being sent to the Friends of Nakwero towards the completion of the Electrical and Mechanical Workshop at the Norfolk Vocational Centre in Uganda. Very many thanks to Sue and Ian Neil for hosting the supper and to everyone who provided delicious food for the event.

CHAPLAINCY AT THE QUEEN ELIZABETH HOSPITAL - Could you spare some time one Sunday a month to help the Chaplaincy at QEH? Often people who come into hospital are church members or have some sort of faith. For these people, coming to our Chapel service on a Sunday morning offers a bit of normality in an unfamiliar place, or a chance to explore ideas of faith. But we need volunteers to help us collect patients from the wards, bring them to the service and return them back to the wards afterwards. We would only ask you to contribute two hours (10am to 12 noon) one Sunday a month, so we wouldn't take you away from your fellowship too much. You would need to be able to push a wheelchair, but no other skills are necessary as full training will be given. For more information, contact Revd. KING'S LYNN WINTER NIGHT SHELTER – The night shelter was set up and operated by King's Lynn Churches Together. It ran very successfully last winter offering accommodation and food for many homeless people. The Purfleet Trust are moving their operation to what used to be the Red Cross centre on Austin Field. This means that their old building - 5 St. Anne's Fort - will be available for the night shelter this winter. This winter the night shelter will be open every night of the week from the beginning of November through until the end of March. Increasing from 2 to 7 nights a week means that the night shelter will need to recruit many more volunteers in addition to the 43 who are already committed to help again. If you might be interested in volunteering at the night shelter, please speak in the first instance to James.
