

A Call to Prayer

If you think about it, we live in a very noisy, interrupting world. A world in which it is difficult to find peace. Think about a typical day. How many conversations do you have with people? How many emails do you receive and send? What about texts messages, Whatsapp messages and messages exchanged through thinks like Facebook? In those moments when you've got the television and radio switched off is it really silent? Whoever is leading will introduce the evening with a brief reflection to help lead us into silent prayer.
